A BRIEF HISTORY OF EGERTON UNIVERSITY

In 1939, Lord Egerton of Tatton donated 320 hectares of land to the Department of Agriculture for the establishment of an agricultural school. The first buildings were constructed in 1940/41 but the first three students were admitted in 1939 on make-shift accommodation. Those early students were British ex-service men returning from World War II, who were being prepared for farming in the Kenya Highlands. Initially courses were informal, and only in the mid-1940s were formal nine months certificate courses introduced. In 1949 the Diploma in Agriculture was initiated.

In 1955 the Government handed over the management of the university to a Board of Governors. When Lord Egerton died in 1958, he left the university a further 1,125 hectares of land.

In 1960, when it was obvious that Kenya's political independence was inevitable, the Act had to be amended and the Board re-organized to allow the College which was up to then an exclusive European preserve, to admit non-European students beginning 1961.

Training was also focused more on the needs and aspirations of an independent Kenya.

In 1986, the College was granted University College status and admitted the first 137 degree students in September.

In 1987, the University College was granted full University status by an Act of Parliament.

The University has continued to grow in student numbers, staff, physical facilities as well as in the number and type of courses offered. Presently there are 1,155 students pursuing 13 different diploma programmes, and 1,905 undergraduate students pursuing nine different degree programmes. The academic staff population stands at 310. It is estimated that a student population of over 5,000 and a staff of over 500 will be in the University by the beginning of academic year 1990/91.

This phenomenal growth is a reflection of the importance Kenya attaches to both development of Education and Agriculture. The University has been associated with these areas of national endeavour throughout its existence.
